Reach 410	<b>Instructional Leadership Residency</b>	4 units	<p>This course examines research on teacher and instructional leadership, individual goal setting, and working with a coach to increase leadership efficacy. Candidates develop a shared understanding of what it means to lead for equity.</p> <p>This course includes independent summer learning that includes online learning and reading books.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 4-5 weekly meetings per course from 4:30-7:30pm</li> <li>• 5 day long Intensives interspersed throughout the year</li> <li>• Summer Learning which includes online learning and reading done independently and remotely</li> <li>• Weekly online discussions</li> <li>• Practicum/ field experience</li> <li>• Individual coaching</li> <li>• Homework (academic reading, online posting and some written work)</li> </ul>
Reach 420	<b>Instructional Leadership Coaching</b>	2 units	Instructional leaders develop and practice foundational knowledge and skills to provide coaching and supervision for teachers focused on improving instruction in their schools.	
Reach 430	<b>How Teachers Learn</b>	2 units	Concepts of how learning occurs in schools, including the conditions schools need to create to foster more effective instruction. The series focuses in particular on promising practices for effective professional development.	
Reach 435	<b>Supervision and Evaluation</b>	1 unit	Examine prevailing rationales and paradigms for supervising and evaluating teachers, and search for effective ways in which to orient supervision and evaluation towards promoting “good teaching”.	
Reach 440	<b>Coaching for Equity</b>	2 units	Bolster knowledge and skills for coaching teachers to be more effective in particular with a focus on promoting equitable outcomes for traditionally underserved students	
Reach 450	<b>Instructional Program Coherence</b>	2 units	Influence the impact of school level instructional frameworks that guide curriculum, teaching, assessment, and the learning climate. Candidates will examine principles of curriculum pedagogy and assessment.	
Reach 460	<b>Fostering Communities of Practice</b>	2 units	Explore what it means to develop thriving adult communities of practice. Examine and evaluate the elements of effective communities of practice, and point the way towards strategies for improvement.	
Reach 465	<b>School Management</b>	2 units	This series will explore those critically important management issues that draw leaders' attention away from instructional leadership, including operations, budgeting, HR, and community partnership development.
